The Challenge

We are all going to edit the same photograph to see how different photographers interpret an image.

Actually we will give you a choice of 4 images, but everyone will be selecting from these 4 images.

Each member can select one image to edit, or you can try all 4 if you want.

All images are straight from camera files which have been converted to Tiff files from the original Raw. These are large files and may take a while to download.

We will be displaying the results on our first meeting back after Christmas.

N.B. When you are editing an image, we would like you to keep notes of the processes you have gone through, so that you can share a summary with us during the presentation of the images.

The Rules

One of the 4 supplied images must be the starting point for your final image, and this must be clearly evident in the final image.

Composites using additional images from any other source are entirely acceptable.

Please note that if you intend to publish your final edit anywhere (including online publication) then you should have copyright or permission for all elements in the image. – The 4 images supplied are copyright Kevin Walters, and full usage rights are given to all members entering this challenge.

There are no other rules!

The Spirit of the Challenge

We encourage you to be adventurous with your editing. Not your usual adjustments, but something more experimental.

Go wild, Go Weird and Wonderful!

Take the opportunity to explore different effects in your editing software. Learning something new is a key objective of this challenge.

We want to see as many different interpretations of each image as our members can come up with.

Do not settle for the mundane! **Let's make this FUN!**

Submitting Your Edited Images

Preferably Submit Images by e-mail to r.k.walters@btinternet.com **before** January 1st 2018 (or you can bring them in on a memory stick on Friday January 5th 2018).

Your finished images should be suitable for displaying as PDI's generally in line with our rules for PDI Entries.

In this instance you may use your name to identify your files, rather than your competition code
